

EMANet (Emergency and Acute Medicine Network for Health Care Research Berlin)

Summary:

EMANet is a network for health care research in emergency and acute care. For EMANet a number of Charité scientific institutes and all emergency departments of the Berlin government district Mitte started a cooperation to investigate structures of health care in emergency patients. The network is supported by the German Federal Ministry of Education and Research. The Institute for Social Medicine, Epidemiology and Health Economics is responsible for the central data management and is involved in the economic analysis of primary and secondary data, which will be available within the framework of the project. The main objective is to observe patients way through the health care system before and after an emergency visit as well as the investigation of utilization patterns and patient outcomes. In addition, the institute supports statistical consulting of all project partners.
